Will you please refer to paragraph 1 of your d.o. letter No. 51/C dated 7th January 1947.

2. In my letter of 23rd December <sup>p. 74/e</sup> it was stated that "The problem of Manipur's future is a particular problem with which the Constituent Assembly will have to deal, it seems, either through the Advisory Committee or by a joint ad hoc Committee". It is hardly possible, at the present stage of developments, to give any more precise indication of the time when, and the manner in which, problems such as Manipur presents will be dealt with.
